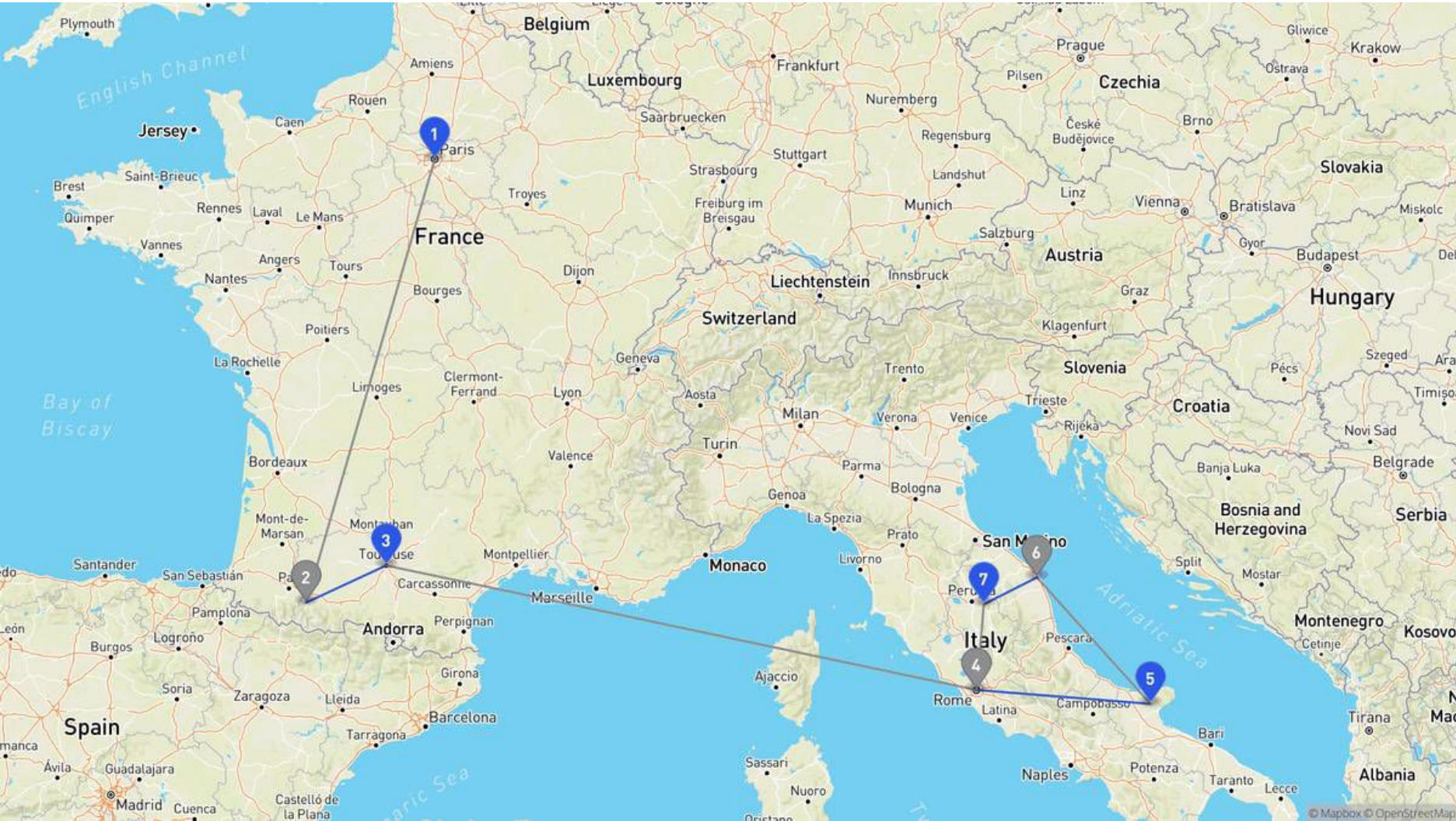

**Day 0 – Thursday, March 26**

Departure from country of origin. Arrival in Paris is recommended on March 27 before 11:00 AM.

Day 1 – Friday, March 27 | Paris

11:30am Departure from Charles de Gaulle Airport in Paris towards Montmartre to the Basilica of the Sacred Heart, a symbol of love, mercy, and reparation. Afterwards, we will depart for the Basilica of Our Lady of Victories, better known as Notre-Dame-des-Victoires, a Marian shrine dedicated to the Virgin of Victories. We will end the afternoon at Notre Dame Cathedral to view the relic of the Holy Cross, which will be on display from 3:00 pm to 6:30 pm. Dinner and rest.

Day 2 – Saturday, March 28 | Paris

Breakfast at the hotel. In the morning, we will visit the Chapel of the Miraculous Medal, attend Mass, and participate in prayers. In the afternoon, we will take a panoramic tour of Paris, visiting the Eiffel Tower (exterior view only), the Arc de Triomphe, the Champs-Élysées, the Place de la Concorde, the Opéra Garnier, and more. After the tour, you will have free time to enjoy a pleasant cruise on the Seine River aboard a Bateaux Parisiens (OPTIONAL, AT AN ADDITIONAL COST) for a magnificent view of the city from a different perspective. In the late afternoon, we will return to the hotel for dinner and rest.

a**Day 3 – Sunday, March 29 | Paris – Lourdes (Palm Sunday)**

Breakfast at the hotel. Option to attend Palm Sunday Mass early in Paris before taking our train to Lourdes. Dinner and rest.

Day 4 – Monday, March 30 | Lourdes (Holy Monday)

Breakfast. Day dedicated to exploring the Sanctuary of Lourdes in depth. We will visit the Basilica of St. Pius X, which can accommodate thousands of pilgrims, the Lower Basilica dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary, the grotto, and the rest of the Sanctuary's buildings. We will also have time to leave the Sanctuary and visit the most significant places in the life of St. Bernadette, such as the mill where she lived with her family, the prison where they were held for a time, and the parish church she attended. In the afternoon, we will continue our visits and have free time. Dinner and overnight stay.

Day 5 – Tuesday, March 31 | Lourdes – Toulouse – Rome (Holy Tuesday)

Breakfast. Transfer to Toulouse and flight to Rome (included). Dinner and overnight.

Day 6 – Wednesday, April 1 | Vatican (Holy Wednesday)

Breakfast. Departure for the Vatican Museums, a vast art gallery housing numerous paintings and sculptures from all periods. During the museum visit, we will see another of the Vatican's jewels and iconic landmarks: the Sistine Chapel, Michelangelo's masterpiece and the site where the conclave of cardinals meets to elect the Pope. The visit concludes inside St. Peter's Basilica, where we can not only marvel at the beauty of the basilica and its countless works of art, but also, as pilgrims, offer personal prayers and present our intentions at the Altar of St. Joseph, the Chapel of the Blessed Sacrament, the altar of the tomb of St. John XXIII, or at the altar of St. Sebastian where the tomb of St. John Paul II is located. Those who wish may also descend to the Pope's tomb. After the visit, we will have free time. Transfer to the hotel. Rest.

Day 7 – Thursday, April 2 | Christian Rome (Holy Thursday)

Breakfast. Today we will explore Christian Rome. First, we will go outside the Roman walls to visit some of the city's catacombs. The catacombs are ancient necropolises where the first Christian communities buried their dead. We will learn about the lives of these early Christian communities. We will then continue our visit to the city's major basilicas. All pilgrims who come to Rome as true pilgrims should visit these basilicas. First, we will visit the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls, where the tomb of the Apostle Paul, the Apostle to the Gentiles, is located. This will be a moment to contemplate the beauty of the basilica and to venerate and ask for graces before the Saint's tomb. We will also visit the Basilica of St. John Lateran, the mother and head of all the churches in Rome and throughout the world. Its grand columns feature representations of all the apostles, and the relics that can be venerated inside include the heads of Peter and Paul, as well as the table from the Last Supper. We will continue our tour of Christian Rome at the Sancta Sanctorum. Next to the Lateran Basilica is the Scala Santa, the Holy Stairs, the staircase from the Praetorium in Jerusalem brought to Rome—the very staircase that Jesus himself climbed. The tour concludes with another of the major basilicas, the one dedicated to Saint Mary. This is the Basilica of Saint Mary Major. Of the basilicas, it is the smallest in size, but perhaps also the most beautiful. Dedicated to the Virgin Mary, inside you will find the image of the Salus Populi Romani, that is, the salvation of the Roman people. We will also find the relic of the manger from Bethlehem. After the visits, free time in Rome. Transfer to the hotel for rest.

Day 8 – Friday, April 3 | Rome – San Giovanni Rotondo (Good Friday)

Breakfast at the hotel.

OPTION 1

Possibility of attending the Passion of Christ reenactment in Rome in the morning, followed by an afternoon excursion to San Giovanni Rotondo. Dinner and rest.

OPTION 2

Departure in the morning for San Giovanni Rotondo and arrival for the Passion of Christ reenactment in the afternoon. Dinner and rest.

Day 9 – Saturday, April 4 | San Giovanni Rotondo & San Angelo

Breakfast at the hotel and a morning dedicated to visiting the Sanctuary of Padre Pio. Saint Pio of Pietecina is possibly one of the most venerated, beloved, and transcendent figures in modern Christianity. His fame, already widespread during his lifetime, reached impressive dimensions after his death, making the Sanctuary of Padre Pio one of the most visited in the world. We will visit the Church of Santa Maria delle Grazie, the parish church where Pio celebrated and attended Mass. We will see the house museum as well as the large basilica where the incorrupt body of the Capuchin friar rests. During the morning, we will have the opportunity for personal prayer at his tomb, as well as attend Holy Eucharist to ask for the intercession and graces of Saint Pio. In the afternoon, we will take a short excursion to the nearby town of Sant'Angelo, on Mount Gargano, where another of the emblematic sites of our pilgrimage to Italy is located: the Cave of Saint Michael. The Sanctuary of Sant'Angelo is a church that houses the image of the Archangel Michael appearing to the local bishop in the 6th century. We will explore the history of this site to understand the veneration and devotion to the Archangel Michael here. Return to the hotel for dinner and rest.

Day 10 – Sunday, April 5 | Lanciano – Loreto (Easter Sunday))

Breakfast at the hotel and departure for Lanciano for our Easter Mass. In this picturesque Italian town near the Adriatic Sea lies the Sanctuary of the Eucharistic Miracle of Lanciano. The so-called Eucharistic miracle took place in the 8th century when a monk had doubts about the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. He discovered, at the moment of the words of consecration during Mass, that the bread and wine transformed into flesh and blood. This miracle was investigated and certified by the Church. Holy Mass at the Sanctuary and time for personal prayer. We will then begin our journey to Loreto. Arrival and overnight stay at the hotel.

Day 11 – Monday, April 6 | Loreto – Asis

Breakfast at the hotel. Morning in Loreto. We will visit the basilica dedicated to the Virgin Mary, where, according to tradition, the house of the Holy Family is located. Afternoon departure for Asis. Visit to the Porziuncola. Overnight in Asis.

Day 12, April 7: Asis (Planary Indulgence for the 800th Anniversary of the Death of St. Francis of Asis)

Breakfast at the hotel. We will explore this medieval city where St. Francis was born and lived. We will begin at the Church of St. Clare, where we can pray at the tomb of the saint who was a friend of St. Francis. Then, we will cross the city through the Town Hall Square and arrive at the Basilica of St. Francis, where the saint's tomb and an impressive collection of art are located. We will also visit the tomb of Blessed Carlo Acutis, a young Italian recently beatified who has given a powerful witness of faith in our time. After Holy Mass, transfer to Rome for rest. Those who wish to extend their trip will depart for Ancona to catch the ferry.

Day 13 – Wednesday, April 8 | Rome – Airport

Breakfast at the hotel and departure for the airport to catch your flight home. Your transfer time will be adjusted to the average for most pilgrims.
